1 August thru 31 August 1945

The month of August started off as did every other month since the war with Japan had commenced on December 7, 1941. Men continued to work, planes continued to fly and the routine business of winning the war continued but no one -- not even the world's greatest optimist could have predicted the great events that were to take place before the month was even half over.

Four missions were flown by the squadron from August 1 through August 9. On the first of August the Hachioji Urban Area was burned out. The following named officers and enlisted men from the squadron participated.

On 11 August another mission was scheduled but not flown. It had been postponed too fast. Briefing was scheduled for 12 o'clock that evening. At about 2200 a town crier went through the mess hall, "The war is over." Everyone woke up and eagerly accepted the news though there was no confirmation. Men kissed each other, hit each other on the back, and an air of general jubilation pervaded throughout the officers and enlisted men areas. A few moments later the announcement came over the loud speaker system that the rumor of the war's ending had not yet been confirmed and the mission would go out. Briefing was called for 12 o'clock and a tense atmosphere could be noted as Colonel Glaer got up to give the introductory remarks. He simply stated that though the war was still on, the mission for some reason had been cancelled. Thunderous applause greeted the announcement and men cheered and cried at the same time. It was an awe inspiring sight. What had happened was this: Japan had transmitted an offer of surrender to the Swiss in compliance with the Potsdam declaration but with a provision that the Emperor retain his royal prerogatives. That offer started the celebrations. About 36 hours after the original offer the allies, through Secretary of State Byrnes answered the Japs saying that the Emperor would take his orders from the Supreme Commander of the Allies who would be designated later. Rumor prevailed that General of the Armies MacArthur would take over supreme command.

Men waited impatiently and when on the 13th of August no word had come in from the Japs the order went out to prepare for a mission. That night no word had come in and so on the early morning of the 14th the squadron planes along with others from the Group and Wing were dispatched to attack a precision target the Hikari Naval Arsenal located ten miles southeast of the city of Tokuyama on the Inland Sea.

Heavy antiaircraft fire was meager to moderate and generally inaccurate over the target. The third formation of planes consisting of 12 B-29's was led over the target by Lt Mappes and his lead crew. Once more with Lt Beck bombing superior results were achieved. Ninety-nine percent of the bombs dropped by this formation fell within 1000 feet of the assigned aiming point. Damage and destruction to the Arsenal was severe. As the planes dived on the return flight to home base the Japanese Radio announced unofficially that the Japs had at last accepted the terms of surrender and the terms were unconditional Surrender.

On the morning of the 15th the long awaited official announcement came over the wires. Japan had surrendered unconditionally. The war was over. Happiness and joy ran rampant. And the men felt proud, proud that they had played a tremendous part in bringing the enemy to her knees. A surrender now meant that millions of American and Allied lives which would have been expended to take the island of Japan by invasion would now be spared and men could return home, happy in the thought that they had done a good job.

Not long after the surrender had been announced men were on orders to go home. High point men first and then down the list by points. The Squadron had been together a long time. Now it was beginning to disintegrate. No one could visualize what the future held. But one thing appeared to be certain. Men, who had left their jobs, their families and their country to fight the war on foreign soil would now go back to their jobs, their country and their family to start life anew and with a feeling of well being that comes from a job well done. They would try to forget the war, but one thing they could not forget were the losses incurred in this war to end wars. They would never forget the men who had died fighting so they could live in a better world.

A fitting climax to the events of the month was the last mission flown. It was a supply dropping mission to prisoners of war interned in Japan, Korea and Formosa. Returning crew members from the Squadron reported their experiences on return to the base. They had seen the prisoner of war camps, they had made a number of runs on the camp and they had dropped their supplies to thousands of deliriously happy men who could be seen jumping up and down and waving their arms in frantic joy. These men, some of whom had been interned since the fall of Corregidor in 1942 knew when they saw this display of American might -- the B-29, that they too would soon be as free as the men who flew the B-29.
