a. The weather over the last few days has been very bad - from about 6:00 AM to 12:00 hrs rainy, which has increased overall efficiency. It is almost impossible to do any work in the heat of the afternoon. Several crews were on TDY with the Main Bu's Gp to help them complete their requirements. Several crew members, both officers and enlisted men, put in a total of 2047 hours on the line, helping them out in the engineering section.

b. Col. Wemple was notified of his assignment in the Regular Army on the 24 of June 1946, the only member of the Squadron to leave the first team.

c. During June, the Squadron lost a B 17 and an AT 11 but picked up three B 29's, taking a total of five B 29's assigned, with one awaiting transfer. Lt. Col. Luschen assumed the duties of Operations Officer, replacing Major Butts, who left for Greensboro, NC on his way overseas.

Col. Wemple, Lt. Fins, P Sgt Supro, 1st White and Cpl Szymeraki participated in an Air Show in Reno, Nevada about the 6th of June 1946. The show was sponsored by the CAF but was put on by the AAF. Col. Wemple led a formation consisting of three B 25's and four A 26's with four P 51's flying top cover. They flew over the city with several prominent citizen's aboard, including the Mayor, who acted as bombardier. Our B 29 seemed to be the main attraction at the show. Souvenir hunters weren't too successful.

4. a. Capt. John C. Pragins was born 11 October 1919 in Fawnboro, Pennsylvania. There he attended the Public and Parochial Schools, later attending the German Township High School, graduating in 1937. During his high school days, he was a member of the track and basketball teams, and quite active in sports. On January 4th, 1937, John C. Pragins enlisted in the Regular Army Air Corps at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, for a three year enlistment. After being sworn in, he was sent to Langley Field, Va., for basic training for a period of three months, where he received rigid, alternate training for the months ahead.

In April, 1938, he was transferred to Randolph Field, Texas, remaining there until 30 November, 1939 performing administrative duties in Base Operations. On 1 December, 1939, he was transferred to March Field, California being assigned to the old 13th Bomb Gp and 4th Air Base Squadron for a short period, later being assigned to the newly activated 23rd Air Base Group, which later went to Alaska. His duties were Squadron Clerk, Ch. of File Clerk of the Group, also being responsible for the Group Message Center, where he later became Asst' Group Sgt. Major. On 3 Jan 41, he was discharged in the grade of Sergeant and finally decided to return to school at Louisiana State University at Baton Rouge, La. After two weeks of schooling at Louisiana State, things weren't going quite as planned, and since he was in the enlisted reserve and the draft was coming up, he re-enlisted in the grade of Private at San Francisco, California for three more years, this time to begin a thirty year stretch, and was assigned to Stockton Field, California. From Stockton he was sent to Armament School, Lowry Field, Denver, Colorado for six months, graduating and returning to March Field, California, where he assumed the duties of Sgt. Major of the 77th Air Base

Group. On 1 July, 1942, he was sent to Officer's Candidate School, Miami Beach, Florida, graduating with a class of 200 officers. During the three months of schooling there, he was a member of Squadron Commander of his Squadron and a trustee in the upper half of his class. Upon graduation, he was assigned to the 91st Bomb Gp, Boise, Idaho for 6 weeks, where he 248th Bomb Gp was activated. Lt. Prigins became the adjutant of the 547th Bomb Squadron until 10 June 1943, at which time he was appointed Executive Officer. On 5 April, 1943, he was made 1st Lt. First and second phase training was received at Endover Field, Utah and third phase training at Sioux City, Iowa. On May 6 1943, he was appointed acting Commanding Officer of his Squadron, being responsible for the movement overseas via Camp Kilmer and Queen Elizabeth, finally arriving at Fife, Scotland. He remained in England 25 months. On 1 Jan 1944, he was promoted to Captain and remained with the Group. His Group flew 319 combat missions over Europe and after V-E Day moved to Southern France to fly the Green Project. Capt. Prigins spent 30 months overseas and later returned to the zone of the Interior. After completion of TDY leave, he was assigned to this organization on the 28th of February, 1946.

a. b. First Sergeant William E. Garberry was born in Providence, RI, 12 July, 1914. His early life was uneventful, he says. He worked for a jeweler for a while, then took up boxing. After travelling around the country, boxing beatup in class, he decided to go to San Francisco, join the Army, and go to Hawaii. On the way to San Francisco, he met a fast talker at Fort Jack Houston, Tex., and on 7 January 1936, found himself in Co. D, 23rd Infantry. He served there until 4 June 1941, when he was transferred to 347th School Squadron at Brooks Field, then to the 502nd School Squadron. Sgt. Garberry was transferred to Lubbock and assigned to the newly organized 848th School Squadron, which later opened up the South Plains AFld, one of the largest glider schools in the world. He became 1st Sgt. on the 16th of May 1942. From South Plains, he volunteered for overseas duty and transferred to the 442nd Fighter Squadron, Westover Field, Mass., then to the 379th Fighter Squadron at Ganton, Conn. He left the US 22nd November 1943 on the Queen Elizabeth and arrived in Guroch, Scotland on the 28th of November, 1943. The 379th operated in combat from Colchester, Eng., then moved to Maidstone where it was bombed several times by the Germans.

The Squadron was then sent to France and Sgt. Garberry crossed the channel in an LST, landing on Omaha Beachhead six days after D-Day. The Squadron worked in support of General Patton's 3rd Army being stationed at various times at A-12 (a fighter strip), Rennes, Rheims, and Etain in France and Rankfurt and Strassburg, Germany. It was while at A-12 that the Squadron suffered the heaviest casualties, having been shelled almost continuously by enemy ground forces. The 379th Squadron shared honors in discovering the breakthrough at the bridge and it was there and at Arrot that the Squadron received its two citations and clusters. Sgt. Garberry has

return to the United States which he did on the USS Gen. C C Norton in July
1945. After landing at Norfolk, he was sent to Camp Atterbury, Ind., where
he reenlisted on the 6th of August, 1945 and chose March Field as his station.
He proceeded there after his furlough and was assigned to the 14th Bomb Sq-
uadron as 1st Sgt on 25 February 1946.
