SQUADRON NISTORY 1 March thru 31 March 1945

Despite the fact that a majority of the ground echelon of the Squadron had left for parts unknown, to set up a new base for operations, the mir cohelon of the squadron also remnants of ground personnel carried on to call a number of combat and photo missions.

The shortage of personnel necessitated that every man out his shoulder to the wheel to keep things rolling and this they did. There was no lask of cooperation on the part of anyone. It was this cooperation that made it possible to run 6 combat missions during the month of Rerch.

The Filet number Command had taken over the task of smashing the Japa in their bomeland. The Exth Comber Command having temporarily been taken out of reach of the homeland were given the job of cracking down on Burma, French - Indo China & Kalaya and bals they did admirably.

The first mission of the mouth was run on 2 March, 1945. At that time in accordance with XX Bomber Corwand Field Order (44, dated 26 February 1946 the group dispatched 12 alreralt to attack the Work Shop area at the Singapore Naval Base, Singapore, Malaya.

Fighter opposition was weak to moderate. A total of 15 to 20 enemy aircraft were reported in the area but most attacks were not closely pressed. Aircraft 162 was attacked twice by single aircraft and then coordinated attacks were made by 5 Jap fighters. Out of the 5 planes attacking, gunners on 162 demaged 1 Oscar which dived away smoking badly and leaving a trail of debris that appeared to be parts of the wing.

The enemy had a scoke screen at the Primary target which was not too effective due to a fairly strong wind from the northeast unich dissipated the screen sufficiently to make visual bombing possible. An additional scoke screen was reported over the empire dock area to the south west of the city of Singapore.

Aith the exception of 2 aircraft from other squadrons landing at emergency fields all aircraft returned safely to home base.

Of the 15 aircraft dispatched by the group only 11 aircraft bombed the rimary torret. 3 of the other h aircraft were ground aborts and 1 aircraft was forced to abort shortly after take-off.

the 11 that did bomb released a total of 65 500 N=6h and 22 500 to 76 type bombs from 22,000 feet through 8/10 to 10/10 cloud cover. Bombing was "Mind" and no reliable observation of bombing was possible. A few crew numbers reported catching momentary glimpse of bomb fluches on the island, but no estimate of results was possible without recommensance whoto raphy. Aircraft bombed in two formations of 3 mircraft, one formation of h aircraft and 1 mircraft bombed individually.

No aircraft fire was encountered and although some enemy aircraft were sighted in the target area, no fighter opposition was forthcoming.

All aircraft returned to base without incident with 1 aircraft stopping at Cox's Bazaar for additional fuel.

On March 17th the group once again dispatched 15 alreraft, this time for a return engagement at Mangoon. The target was dum "B". This was simply a continuation of the systematic pounding that the B-20's were giving murply points set up by the Japs to aid their forces in Eurma. Previously our planes had hit dump "P". The Japs had concentrated 75% of all supplies in Burna in the Bangoon area with 50% in the three dump "A", "B" & "F". By knowling out these dumps, the 29's were hastening the day mean allied forces would anter Rangoon and end the tyrency of the Japa in Burna.

All the direct were eirborne but 2 were forced to jettisen bembe in the Bay of Sungal dute to mechanical failure. One of these sirerals was 1655 flown by let Lt Found Brown, which efter partiagning the bomblood, returned safely to base.

13 aircraft boabed the assigned primary target from 5,000' pressure altitude, dron ing a total of 115 M-6h fused .1 sec. nose, non-delay tail and 2h 1-76 fused non-delay nose and tail. Observed bombing results were excellent and it was felt that very considerable damage was accomplished.

No fighter o condition was encountered and only meager and inaccurate Antimirerant fire was reported.

This was a notable mission for 2 reasons - First, takeoffs were made churing the nest of the day with airplane weights at 134,000 lbs; secondly this was the first bombing mission in which the group had employed such low altitude levels and the results were very matifying.

All dreraft returned safely to base without incident.
